Join Yusuf Mohammed from Intercultural Management Education in these 3 live virtual sessions tailored specifically for Grade K-12 educators on Building Cultural Capacity. These sessions focus on equipping educators with the knowledge, strategies, and skills necessary to create culturally inclusive/responsive classrooms and support diverse student populations.

Session 1. Culturally Responsive Teaching

Objective: Help teachers integrate culturally responsive strategies into their teaching practices for grades K-12. Key Points:

- Understanding the cultural backgrounds of students and their impact on learning
- Adapting curriculum materials to reflect diverse perspectives
- Promoting student engagement and academic success through inclusive teaching practices

Session 2. Bias Recognition and Mitigation in the Classroom

Objective: Equip teachers with tools to identify and reduce bias in their teaching and interactions with students.

Key Points:

• Understanding how unconscious bias affects classroom dynamics and student outcomes

- Reflecting on personal biases and their impact on teaching
- Strategies for creating equitable learning environments that minimize bias

Session 3. Building Cultural Competency in Student Relationships

Objective: To enhance teachers' ability to build strong, respectful relationships with students from diverse cultural backgrounds.

Key Points:

- Building trust and rapport with students from diverse cultural and ethnic backgrounds
- Developing culturally sensitive communication skills
- Promoting a classroom culture of respect, empathy, and inclusion
